

In 1866, Rev. John Y. De Baun began publishing a 16-page monthly for the True Protestant Reformed Dutch Church in New Jersey. The magazine was originally called *The Banner of Truth*, based on Psalm 60:4—"You have given a banner to them that fear you, to be displayed because of the truth." In 1887, Rev. De Baun became the first pastor of LaGrave Avenue CRC in Grand Rapids, Mich., and brought the magazine along with him. Through changes in ownership, name, and publication schedule, not to mention editors, reporters, reviewers, and columnists, *The Banner* has remained faithful to being a forum and a mirror for members of the Christian Reformed Church in North America and beyond for the past 160 years.
